- Conceptualize, design and prepare a variety of print and digital materials, including posters, flyers, large-format prints, table tents, digital signage, and web images.
- Utilize the designated project management software consistently by uploading drafts, communicating with other team members, and disseminating feedback.
- Maintain an organized portfolio of in-progress and completed projects.
- Work collaboratively with the marketing team and its clients; be willing and able to receive constructive feedback on designs and layout.
- Prioritize projects and maintain a consistent work schedule to efficiently balance workload.
- Develop knowledge of the latest graphic design techniques.
- Completion of all other duties assigned by the Marketing & Graphic Design Specialist and Marketing Coordinator.

Qualifications

- Completion of Graphic Design Studio I & II (DESIGN 331 AND 332) and sophomore or junior class standing is desired.*
- Applicants are required to have artistic skills in design and layout and must have experience with Adobe Illustrator, Adobe Photoshop, and preferably InDesign.
- Skills with drawing tablets (including iPads) are a plus.
- Familiarity with the UW-Green Bay and the University Union and its departments/services is desired.
- Applicants will be required to present a portfolio of original artwork to be examined at the interview.
