## **Resolution to involve students in the review of Title IX reporting and training processes**

**Whereas:** The Student Government Association of the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay has been made aware of problems with the Title IX reporting process;

**Whereas:** The webpage on the Title IX and Clery Act within the UW-Green Bay website states the following:

“Under the [Clery] Act, institutions must provide survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking with options such as changes to academic, transportation, or living, or working situations, and assistance in notifying local law enforcement, if the student or employee chooses to do so. It also provides both parties in a campus disciplinary process certain rights,”<sup>1</sup> and that

“Colleges and universities must outline specific policies and procedures within their annual security reports, including those related to disseminating timely warnings and emergency notifications, options for survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking, and campus crime reporting processes;”<sup>2</sup>

**Whereas:** In conversation with Senator Zea Miller, a UW-Green Bay student who asked to remain anonymous stated that, after the investigation had commenced, their assaulter received no consequences for their actions;

**Whereas:** This student stated that they felt like UW-Green Bay was “sweeping issues like this under the rug;”<sup>3</sup>

**Whereas:** In conversation with Senator Zea Miller, a UW-Green Bay student who asked to remain anonymous stated that, during an investigation regarding physical misconduct, there were errors in communication between various campus entities that prevented the investigation from being completed in a timely manner;<sup>4</sup>

**Whereas:** This student also stated that they felt like UW-Green Bay wasn't taking instances of misconduct seriously;

**Whereas:** Title IX policies are reviewed continually by the university, according to email conversation between Dr. Corey King, Vice Chancellor for University Inclusivity and Student Affairs, and Harrison Thiry, Speaker of the Senate;

**Whereas:** The Student Government Association of the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay recognizes the need for student representation in this review process;

**Therefore, be it resolved:** The Student Government Association of the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay calls for the inclusion of student opinion from all four campuses (Green Bay, Sheboygan, Marinette, and Manitowoc) in this review process;

**Therefore, be it further resolved:** The University President of the Student Government Association of the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay shall appoint member(s) of Student Government Associations of UW-Green Bay to represent students in this review process;

**Therefore, be it finally resolved:** The appointment of student representatives shall not be subject to confirmation, due to the time-sensitive nature of the project.
